The National Interest has necessitated a record rate of release from the Navy during March and April. This has thrown a great strain on the manning of the Fleet and establishments, which has been most marked in the Supply, Secretariat, Regulating and Engine Room Branches of the Navy.

- 2. Their Lordships' are woll aware of the great efforts made, particularly in the branches named, to ope with the extra burden laid on them and more generally of the fact that the whole process or release has cassed officers and men serving on regular engagements in all branches to bear a high percentage of the foreign and sea service. Their Lordships! regret that this has been necessary when, after more than seven years of war conditions, these Continuous Service men were looking forward to some easement and the blessings of family life of which they have been deprived.
- gestablishments at present manned are fully effected, difficulties in manning will increase and there can be little easement of the load borne by the Continuous Service ratings, since it is vital in the National Interest that the numbers planned be released to civil life punctually and to the maximum possible extent.
- 4. So far, therefore, retnetion under the Military Necessity Clause of ratings due for release has been avoided except in a very few cases. The release programme of the various categories of personnel has been carefully adjusted at the Admiralty to this end, while still providing for the manning of the Fleet, albeit with much dilution.
- 5. With regard, however, to ratings now shortly due to be released, it is expected that Commanders in Chief, and Flag Officers in Charge of drafting will find it necessary to invoke the Military Necessity Clause for the retention of individuals more frequently than hitherto. Their Lordships wish this course of action to be adopted rather than adding to the load already borne by those officers and men not due for release or increasing the strain of administering ships and establishments.

In addition the Navy is unbalanced as between different categories of ratings. The extended service men will fill the gap during the ensuing critical manning years, and the numbers accepted will be adjusted to secure the required balance between the different categories in the post war fleet. The response needed during 1946 to achieve the desired result amounts to about 26,000 extended service engagements which represents about 1 in every 12 of those eligible by length of service who would otherwise be released.
